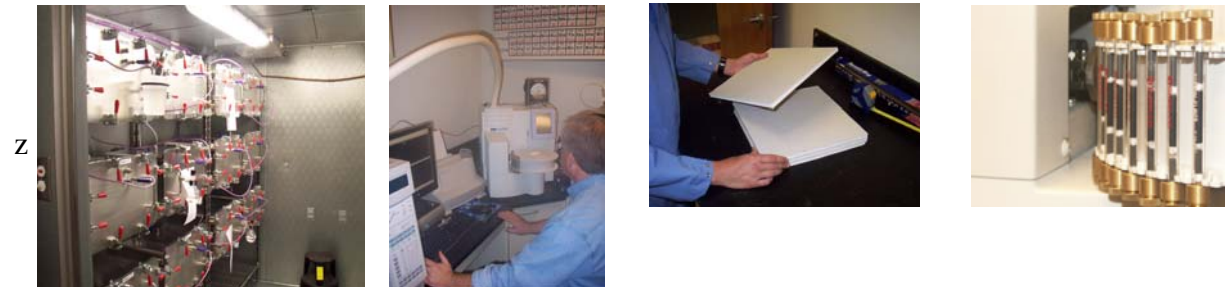

This program was specifically created to help builders, designers, architects and consumers find products which meet the indoor air quality guidelines called for under LEED, GSA and Municipal building specifications. The **Certified Green** mark is your assurance of indoor air quality compliance on products that display it; backed by a rigorous program that helps manufacturers continuously monitor and regulate VOC emissions from their products.

For 2012 the LEED rating system awards up to 2 credits* for compliant building uses of **MAS Certified Green®** products in each of these categories:

- **Interior Paints and Coatings** – for content and emissions
- **Interior Adhesives and Sealants** – for content and emissions
- **Built-In Cabinetry** – applied to walls
- **Architectural Woodwork** – applied to interior walls
- **Flooring Systems** – carpet, raised, resilient, composite, wood, and poured floors and underlayments
- **Ceiling & Wall Systems** – gypsum board, insulation, acoustical tiles and wall coverings
- **Furniture** – inclusive of office and classroom workstations, components and seating products

**Low emitting material credits are also available under the collaborative for High Performing Schools (CHPS) program, the ANSI/BIFMA e3 Sustainability Standard, the NSF 140 Standards.*
